President's Report

On behalf of the Board of the Manly Warringah District Junior Rugby Football League, I am pleased to present the Annual Report for season 2015.

This year we had 2,300 players registered in 152 teams across all age groups ranging from Under 6's to A Grade. It was encouraging to see growth in the junior registration numbers with many Clubs fielding two sides in the Under 6's to Under 10's divisions.

Our season ended with twenty grand finals across two venues including nine deciders at Lionel Watts Oval and eleven first division deciders at Brookvale Oval.

This year the Under 8's competition was non-competitive (and therefore no Grand Final) but the Junior League took the initiative to play all of the Under 8 teams in a "promotion" game on Brookvale Oval. It was an early start on both Saturday and Sunday but the kids had fun and all players were rewarded with a medallion. I am sure that they will always remember playing a game of footy at Brookvale Oval.

Looking at the season results, it was pleasing to see that all Clubs had teams in the semi-finals and nearly all Clubs had at least one team playing in the Grand Finals. I watched every Grand Final played at Brookvale Oval over two days and was continually impressed with the high standard of rugby league played across all age groups. There are many future sea eagle stars running around in the junior league aspiring to pull on a maroon and white jersey.

But the highlight for me was seeing many of the younger kids playing in their first Grand Final. It is a shame we can't get all of the Grand Finals onto Brookvale Oval but we only get one weekend which limits the number of games.

I would like to congratulate all teams that reached the Grand Finals but more importantly, all of our registered players who strapped on the boots and had a go - win, lose or draw. The benefits of playing in a team sport are significant and you make friends for life whilst have fun along the way.

The task of running the junior league can be challenging but we only succeed because of the huge contribution made by our large band of volunteers who give up their own precious time to help promote football. These people set up the fields, run the canteen, cook the barbecue, clean up the grounds, coach, manage and supervise the various teams and I thank them for their assistance.

I would also like to thank the Referees for their contribution to junior rugby league which at times can be demanding as everyone seems to be an expert on the sideline. I am of the opinion that no

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one is entitled to pass comment on a Referee's performance unless they have refereed a game themselves as it is more involved than it looks. I would like to encourage anyone who thinks they can do better to get your referees ticket and get involved.

It is also important to highlight the financial assistance provided by the Manly Warringah Leagues Club which has supported the junior league for many years. I have said many times that without the Leagues Club support, the junior league could not function in its current form and I thank the Leagues Club Board for their contribution and assistance including use of the meeting rooms in the Federal Parade car park. If you are not a current member, I would ask everyone involved in junior rugby league to join the Leagues Club and take advantage of its facilities to show our support for its contribution.

Thanks also to the members of the Manly Warringah Junior Rugby League Board and Executive who also give up their valuable time in running our various competitions. Many of these people volunteer at their own Club but also find time to help run the junior league including judiciary matters, Code of Conduct issues, registering and maintaining the data base, monitoring player movements and actually running the competitions, which is greatly appreciated.

I would also like to acknowledge the support of the Sea Eagles and, in particular the Junior League Development Officers. We were also fortunate this year to have senior Manly NRL players attend our Grand Final presentations which is greatly appreciated and is a great image for our game.

Thanks also to the Manly Warringah District Club who provide assistance in judiciary appeal matters and general corporate guidance when required. It is a major benefit knowing that the Manly Warringah Junior Rugby League can call on the scholarship and support of the District Club, the Leagues Club and the Manly Sea Eagles if required.

It is also appropriate to acknowledge the parents, grandparents and carers whom, amongst other things, get the kids to training and home and away games. Thanks also to the many supporters who attend our game days and barrack from the sideline. Whilst the junior league encourages supporters to cheer from the sideline, we must remember that it is not the NRL and any unfounded criticism or unsocial behaviour is not welcome.

Lastly, it would be remiss of me not to highlight the significant contribution to Junior Rugby League by Peter O'Dwyer who, after many years as Junior League Secretary, is taking a well earned break. Peter's knowledge of the rules, administration skills, guidance and support will be sorely missed but I am sure that he will continue to be involved in some capacity when his help is needed.

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In my third year as President, I would like to thank everyone who contributed to running the game. At times the commitment to run junior rugby league can be challenging but let's not forget that some of the main objectives of playing football include having fun, keeping fit and looking out for your team mates which, in my view, is a great Australian tradition.

Hope to see you in 2016.

Treasurer's Report

On behalf of the Board of the Manly Warringah District Junior Rugby Football League, I am pleased to present the Financial Statements for season 2015.

This year the junior league has been under increasing financial pressure with rising in costs including Sporting Union fees, player's insurance and Referees payments.

Fortunately our 2015 budget anticipated many of these increases and I am pleased to say that we operated at a modest financial surplus.

More pleasing is that all of our thirteen Clubs were financial in 2015 having paid their required affiliation fees, nomination fees and senior insurance costs. My thanks to the individual Club Treasurers for their role in monitoring their club's financial position.

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In this year's financial accounts, the major expenditure items included player's insurance (\$73,404.50), Referees Fees (\$46,678) and Sporting Union Fees (\$13,235.60) which represents over 75% of our total cost in just three items.

It is important to acknowledge the financial support of the Manly Warringah Leagues Club which contributes to the running of the junior league each year. I am sure that the Leagues Club's support during the difficult trading times over the past few years has not been easy but the Board's philosophy of supporting junior rugby league has never wavered and is greatly appreciated by all those involved in our great sport.

Our Grand Final Sunday at Brookvale Oval was a financial success for the junior league and despite the significant running costs with security and other expenses, we hope that the profitability can continue.

The Board will continue to monitor costs to keep our overheads down and I am pleased to report that team nomination fees will not increase in 2016 which is a good start.

Our 'Duty of Care' is to operate in a manner that brings credit to the Code of Rugby League

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and administer justice in an unbiased manner. We are fully aware of the privacy afforded to juveniles (players of tender age). In this case, if a player is under the age of 14 years and is 'removed or replaced from the field', then that child will not be identified in any report relating to that matter outside the Judiciary.

The National Safe Play Code is utilised for Saturday teams between the ages of Under 6 years and Under 15 years.

All our reports have been submitted in a very comprehensive manner that have withstood the challenges of 'appeals' at a higher hearing. I thank the Narrabeen Club for their co-operation and use of their clubhouse during the season.

On another note, I must thank Shane, Luke and Keith (Referees) for their co-operation and professionalism in Referee reports and the fact that Luke often sent his young Referees to sit in on 'hearings' so that they would familiarise themselves with the workings of this committee. To Michael Covey and his Executive, I thank you for your support during a very trying season where things seem to build up and make it difficult to run this competition. You handled each matter with professionalism and came up with the right decisions which benefitted all the clubs and brought them closer together to form a bond.
